3. **LOCATION:** Asia Regional Office (ARO), Bangkok, Thailand
4. **DURATION:** 12 months (renewable)
5. **REPORTING RESPONSIBILITIES:**

6. COMPLIANCE WITH THE DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY

The Technical Officer, Forest and Agriculture is expected to comply with the IUCN Delegation of Authority (DoA) current at any particular time, and the sub-delegations issued thereof. Such compliance must be exercised with due diligence and regard for the letter, spirit and purpose of the DoA.

7. BACKGROUND:

IUCN is the largest professional global conservation network dealing with environment and sustainable development with more than 1,500 member organizations including 200+ government and 900+ non-government organizations and over 15,000 voluntary scientists and experts, grouped in seven Commissions in some 160 countries.

IUCN is an equal opportunity employer. We promote personal and professional development. Supervision and mentorship are provided at different levels. Direct supervision and mentorship are provided by the line manager.

IUCN ARO manages the regional programme for Asia through its regional office in Bangkok and network of offices in 12 countries across the region. ARO's Science and Strategy Group (SSG) leads the planning and implementation of IUCN Asia's regional programme agenda and strategy.

One of its five programme areas is "Forest and Agriculture Landscapes", which covers the conservation and sustainable use of natural resources for forest, agriculture and related land-uses. Under this programme area, IUCN Asia addresses the challenges of nature conservation and sustainable development in relation to: biodiversity and land health management, nature-based solutions and ecosystems services provisioning, climate and disaster-risk resilience, and private-sector engagement and sustainable business models.

8. MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES:

- i. Assists in developing the regional programme area on Forest and Agriculture Landscapes.
- ii. Provides technical expertise support to assigned projects.
- iii. Co-leads in formulating novel project ideas and in grant-writing.

9. SPECIFIC DUTIES:

- i. Assists in further developing the regional programme area on Forest and Agriculture Landscapes.
 - facilitates IUCN Asia peer-learning and experience-sharing, as well as stock-taking of relevant knowledge and practices,
 - explores and helps establish strategic partnerships with IUCN members and commissions, and with relevant national/regional/global institutions and alliances.

- represents regional team in relevant events within and beyond IUCN, to help the programme area's further strategic development.
- ii. Provides technical expertise support to assigned projects
 - serves as member in collaborative, multi-disciplinary teams for project planning, implementation and reporting.
 - serves as technical expert for capacity building activities and field-backstopping missions of assigned projects.
- iii. Co-leads in formulating novel project ideas and in grant-writing
 - facilitates the development of novel project ideas and concepts aligned with regional programme agenda and IUCN programme results framework.
 - leads and/or contributes to proposal development, grant-writing and resource mobilisation.

Please Note: The above TORs contain the main responsibilities and duties of this position. However, in an ever-evolving organisation such as IUCN, staff members are expected to show flexibility in their approach to work and be willing to undertake other tasks that are reasonably allocated to them but which are not part of their regular TORs. Where any task becomes a regular part of staff member's responsibilities, the TORs should be changed in consultation between the manager, the staff member and the HR Unit. Any one of the three may initiate the consultation.

10. POSITION REQUIREMENTS

- Bachelor's degree in Forestry, Agriculture, Natural Resources or a closely related field; Master's degree is highly desirable.
- At least two years of relevant professional experience in research, development and/or academic setting.
- Interest in and knowledge of key nature conservation and sustainable development challenges in Asia's agriculture and forest sector.
- Written and spoken proficiency in English.
- Good knowledge of Word, Excel and database interface.
- Excellent interpersonal, organisational and team-building skills.
- Ability to adapt to new environments, and to establish and maintain good working relations with individuals of different cultural backgrounds.
