ORGANISATIONAL CONTEXT AND ORGANISATIONAL SETTING

The International Trade Centre (ITC) assists developing and transition economy countries to take advantage of expanding trade opportunities in an increasingly complex global environment. ITC supports Trade Impact for Good, promoting sustainable and inclusive development goals through trade.

The Division of Market Development (DMD) offers technical assistance to public and private sectors to create inclusive, sustainable business environments for increased trade and investment. It integrates the business perspectives into trade development strategies, negotiations, and domestic policy reforms.

The SME Trade Academy is committed to delivering high-quality educational experiences through both online and face-to-face courses.

The goal of this position is to assist in designing, developing, and evaluating instructional materials and experiences. This includes both online and face-to-face courses. The Instructional Designer will be involved at all stages of the course development process and will interact with Subject Matter Experts and ITC project managers to create effective and engaging learning solutions.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Under the overall guidance of the Programme Manager, and direct supervision of the Senior Advisor: E-Learning the Junior Professional Officer will:

- Assist in designing instructional materials, including course outlines, syllabi, lesson plans,, assessments, and activities for both online and face-to-face courses; monitor and analyze the development and implementation process, identifying and tracking follow-up actions.
- Collaborate with Subject Matter Experts and ITC project managers to ensure content accuracy and relevance.
- Utilize instructional design models and theories to create effective learning experiences.
- Support the integration of technology tools and platforms to enhance learning experiences.
- Assist in the development and implementation of Al-driven learning activities and assessments.
- Monitor and evaluate emerging educational technologies; propose viable applications of these technologies to improve course delivery methods.

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- Ensure that all graphic design elements align with the branding and instructional goals of the courses.
- Participate in the review and evaluation of instructional materials to ensure quality, consistency, and alignment with learning objectives.
- Collect and analyze feedback from learners and instructors to continuously improve course content and delivery.
- Provide support and training to instructors and technical experts on the use of instructional technologies and best practices in teaching and learning.
- Assist in troubleshooting technical issues related to course delivery.
- Assist in managing instructional design projects, including timelines, deliverables, and stakeholder communication.
- Perform any other related duties as required.
