A broker is not indispensable to rent in Stockholm. However, it is a useful resource because some landlords don't post their vacancies to the public but prefer to make them available through broker agencies. There shall be a fee associated with being paid to a licensed real estate agent/broker for services. Under UNICEF procedure on Rental Subsidies and Deductions, a reimbursement of the one-time payment of an agent's fee can be requested under rental subsidy guidelines once during a staff member's assignment to a duty station. Schools & In the Swedish school system, children go to school for at least ten years from the year Childcare they turn six, as mandated by the Swedish Education Act. Sweden's long focus on education is quoted as one of the explanations for the country's capacity for innovation. Sweden is a country built around staunch equality and community spirit. This directly influences their school system, where children are taught the same subjects until they are old enough to make their own education / career choices. Official academic start and end dates may fluctuate slightly by municipality and school, but on average, school in Sweden begins around mid / late-August and ends early / mid-June. The year is broken up into two semesters. There is a long break in December from the middle of the month until early January. For younger kids, school hours are typically 8:30 to 14:30. Older students start at the same time and leave around 15:00 or 16:00.


Public schools in Sweden are free. Annual tuition for private schools, however, will

typically fall between 30,000 SEK to 100,000+ (3,000 to 10,300+ USD). Hey Kiddo, contracts nannies who care for children of all ages. They offer different plans based on the type of support parents need (sporadic, continuous, everyday help). Their nannies are experienced and have gone through the agency's recruitment process. They have all passed a DBS check, are educated in CPR and they have all gone through and passed Hey Kiddo 's internal nanny- course. The first step is that you will get a presentation of a nanny. If you approve, the nanny will call you to book the first session. This first session is for you as a parent to get to know the nanny and find out if she is the right person for your family. You can meet in person or digitally at no charge for this time (usually the session is maximum one hour). Hey Kiddo, office will later call to ensure that you are happy with the nanny you've got. They will also secure the price plan. Please note that for UNICEF staff who do not pay Swedish Taxes/have a Swedish Social Security Number; the price will be double what is listed as they are not covered by the RUT tax deduction. Strategic office context:

The fundamental mission of UNICEF is to promote the rights of every child, everywhere, in everything the

This is why the focus on equity is so vital. It accelerates progress towards realizing the human rights of all children, which is the universal mandate of UNICEF, as outlined by the Convention on the Rights of the Child, while also supporting the equitable development of nations.
