The position specifically supports activities aimed at the elimination of diseases such as Malaria, Lymphatic Filariasis, Trachoma, Schistosomiasis, Leprosy, Rabies, and Soil-Transmitted Helminths (STH) as public health problems, eradication of Yaws and elimination of mother-to-child transmission of HIV, Syphilis, and Hepatitis B.</p> <p>The roles will include technical support to the Member States to enhance Primary Health Care capacity in critical areas such as integrated disease screening, diagnosis, treatment, care and support, disability and morbidity management, disease prevention, and integrated disease surveillance. In addition, the JPO will support the ICD unit in strengthening data collection, analysis, and reporting and supporting countries in their requests for health commodities required for disease elimination. The JPO will also support activities to enhance special approaches such as Preventive Chemotherapy, Transmission Assessment Surveys, preparation of dossiers to validate disease elimination by WHO dossiers review groups and post-elimination surveillance. This work includes coordination and collaboration within WHO, including WHO Headquarters and Country Offices, and coordination with the relevant external stakeholders such as national, regional, and global validation committees. The responsibilities will also involve producing timely and accurate reports and participating in field missions and global and regional meetings.</p> <p>At the WHO's Regional Office for the Western Pacific, we are committed to fostering the learning, professional growth, and advancement of our Junior Professional Officers (JPO).
